We are using ARI Smart Content in a University Environment.

We have a 'development' environment where the tool worked perfectly, no problems at all. But when we put it in our production environment (which has more security and different permissions), we get the following error:

Error:

Fatal error: require once(): Failed opening required '/mnt/web/cms/genetics/cache/arismartcontent config.php' (include path='.:/usr/share/php7:/usr/share/php7/PEAR') in /mnt/web/cms/genetics/administrator/components/com arismartcontent/kernel/Utils/class.Config.php on line 62

Note this error comes up on our HOME PAGE of the website, so basically the site 'crashes' and is a complete white page, until I turned the error handler on, and i can see the error above.

For our site to not be 'white screen', I had to disable ALL of the plugins with ARI Smart Content.

Also in our production environment, when I go to the ADMINISTRATION page for ARI SMART CONTENT I also get a 500 error.

Any ideas?

Where in my development environment the file has rw permissions, so this is the problem.

So based on our security my admin said:

"But I see you are wanting a php file to have access. The second line above explicitly forbids that. The idea is that we don't to execute php scripts from a writeable area of the site (like temp or cache). This reduces the chance that someone can upload something malicious and execute it with the privs of the web server."

We basically set all php files to not be writeable when in a 'writeable directory'...
