I've got a strange problem with ari image slider in my joomla 2.5 website:

I put the slider module with a 400x400 window parameter, since I've transform my pictures from their original format to 400x400 with a black border when it's necessary.

For some unknown reason, some pictures shows correctly, but some other are automatically rotated 90° right. If I open these pictures in a picture's editor, they show correctly. I've try to rotate them 90° left in my picture's editor (to avoid the problem, I was thinking that the automated rotating will turn them again 90° right and so they will be as I want), and then they show in my website as in my editor...:dry:

I actually don't understand what happens, because my pictures are all oriented the same way, and all 400x400...

If someone knows how to avoid this "automated rotate" function...
