What I mean is: when someone selects any answer in question, it automatically autoscrolls down to a next question. And I need an offset, because I have a fixed menu at the top. I tried different css selectors of this fixed menu to make a needed offset. But there isn't any selector, that suits all the screen widths.

Right now on mobile phones and PC offset is okay, but on tablets it's awful - it covers question titles during autoscroll. So I decided to make different offsets in px for different screen widths, by using @media.

You can specify CSS selector instead of absolute values in "Scroll offset" parameter. In this case the plugin will get height of specified element as offset for scrolling. In your case use the following CSS selector:

It does work fine for laptops, PCs and mobile phones, because I managed to pick a good offset in px.

But it's a bad offset for tablets. Here is a screenshot of 768x1024px screen width offset - <https://ibb.co/hM5fsDM> . I added an arrow, where a question title is located, right after I press one of answers. I used this website for testing - <http://responsivetesttool.com/> . It's a good website for such purposes.

I just don't want to make a bigger offset to fit all the screen widths at once. Because if I will fit tablets, then mobile phones and laptops/PCs will have very big offset. I don't want that. Tablets are less important to me, but still ARE important.

It is not possible to use @media queries for this purpose. The plugin accepts absolute values as offset or an element (usually it is sticky header) to get height of this element at runtime. In your case probably it needs to specify another element (not #masthead) because site theme for some dimensions adds margin to this element and it can affect on offset. We guess It is possible to use an inner element in #masthead element.
